

## **KNOW THE RULES** ELECTION AND REFERENDUM ADVERTISING

Individuals and organizations that intend to sponsor advertising related to the May 2009 Provincial General Election or Referendum on Electoral Reform need to know the rules.

- You must be registered with Elections BC to sponsor or conduct election advertising
- Election advertising sponsors, other than candidates or registered political parties, can only sponsor advertising worth \$3,000 in a single electoral district and \$150,000 province-wide from February 13 to May 12, 2009, inclusive
- Only registered proponent and opponent groups and registered referendum advertising sponsors can sponsor or conduct referendum advertising from February 1 to May 12, 2009, inclusive
- There are no spending limits for registered referendum advertising sponsors or proponent or opponent groups
- Referendum advertising and election advertising cannot be combined except by registered political parties and candidates

## New career incentive for veterans

Little Caesars, the world's largest carry-out pizza chain, is offering Canadian veterans an opportunity to open a franchise at a reduced cost as a way of saying thanks for protecting our country.

Honourably released veterans who qualify as Little Caesars franchisees receive a \$10.000 discount off franchise-related costs on their first store. Medically released veterans can receive up to \$35,000 in credits and discounts on their first store.

To help veterans transition into the business, ongoing support and training, access to preferred lenders and other marketing resources are included with this program.

"It's really giving back

to the men, women and families who have dedicated their lives to the services, and we are so proud to be doing this," said Richard Greville, vice president and general manager of Little Caesars Canada.

The idea began when Little Caesars' founder Michael Ilitch read a story on Army Staff Sgt Robbie Doughty, an injured U.S. veteran who lost both legs in Iraq. Ilitch, a U.S. Marine, had been a minor league baseball player, but an injury ended his baseball career. Understanding the difficulty in making a new career start, he could relate to the crossroads Sgt Doughty faced as he determined what to do

Ilitch was so impressed with Sgt Doughty's attitude after meeting and getting

to know him, he gave the soldier a Little Caesars franchise

Helping one veteran successfully led him to initiate the Little Caesar's Veterans Program, which began on Veterans Day in 2006 in the United States.

Forty-five U.S. veterans have applied for more than \$1.25 million in credits and benefits to help them grow their Little Caesars businesses. Several veterans have opened their second

Little Caesars has now expanded the opportunity across the border into Canada.

Sgt (Ret'd) William Bourque, who served in the U.S. Marine Corps, qualified through the U.S. program and opened a pizzeria in Moncton, New Brunswick, in June 2007.

"For absolutely anyone who has an inkling of wanting to become an entrepreneur, it's a great opportunity," he says. "It's an honourable thing to recognize people who have fought for their country. Business is good and it's been everything we had anticipated it would be."

Applications from honourably discharged Canadian veterans are being accepted until Dec. 31, 2009. "Little Caesars is growing, and we have many prime franchise locations available, and welcome applications from all qualified, honourably released veterans," said Greville.

## Manitoba soldiers blast the pass

Hidden deep in the snowy mountains of Rogers Pass, along the Trans Canada Highway, 13 soldiers live in remote barracks through the winter months. Their purpose in this secluded setting is to await word from Parks Canada officials to blast for avalanches.

For 50 years, the soldiers from CFB Shilo, Manitoba's 1 Royal Canadian Horse Artillery (1RCHA) have rotated through the winter months, securing 105mm Howitzer guns to platforms and shooting into the mountains to stimulate an avalanche.

The mission is known as Operation Palaci, and assists Parks Canada's Avalanche Control program to ensure clear highways and safe travel through the Rockies.

"This past week has been far from typical," said Bruce McMahon, Senior Avalanche Officer at Mount Revelstoke and Glacier National Parks. "This year there seems to be a shift in snow patterns that haven't been prevalent for many years, perhaps decades."

Snow has accumulated over a weak layer, which has forced the troops to close the highway for long periods of time to clear many avalanches, said McMahon.

As a snow technician with Parks Canada since 1980, McMahon is responsible for analyzing conditions and organizing the troops. His expertise in snow science allows him to identify hazardous situations and tell the troops when to blast.

"We allow many avalanches to occur on their own [naturals] and then choose to intervene with artificial stabilization," said McMahon.

The unique area is vast with over 100 avalanche passes in a 40 kilometre distance, making it necessary to use Howitzer guns to initiate an avalanche. In other areas of B.C. propane generated bursts and charges dropped from helicopters are used to clear avalanches.

"This is the largest mobile avalanche program in the world," said Maj Geoff Allen, Joint Task Force Pacific Desk Officer and coordinator with Parks Canada. "Helicopter explosives are also used in Rogers Pass, but the Howitzers have an advantage as they can be used in poor weather conditions."

Each fall, McMahon liaises with Joint Task Force Pacific and 1RCHA to plan the deployment season of the troops to Rogers Pass, usually from November to April.

The preparation begins in November when three guns, ammunition and equipment are trucked by the soldiers and established in the Pass. Then they return home and wait for the call to start their mission.

"The actual call for deployment is dependent on how the early season storms develop, and we monitor the early season snowpack closely, said McMahon.

Upon receipt of the call, the soldiers board a bus, bringing their own cook and personal gear, and drive 24 hours, rotating drivers, in order to get to Rogers Pass quickly.

"There is a broad range of missions, and we often have short amounts of time to set things in motion and still be ahead of the game. We set a date for the troops that is conservative enough to cover early season storm possibilities and to ensure sufficient briefing, test firing and safety training," said McMahon. "This is why it takes such a dedicated and focused team that is always at the ready."

A typical mission involves closing a section of highway, shooting out the unstable snow and allowing the traffic to pass. "Highway closures

total only 100 hours a year on average, and our preference is for numerous short closures to conduct the control missions."

When not blasting avalanches, the troops must maintain operational readiness. The 18 gun positions to house the Howitzers are scattered along a 40km stretch of road and the gun rings need to be clear of snow in order for the Howitzers to be secured into position to fire.

Each rotation spends six weeks in the mountains and must be at the ready 24 hours a day. "This is a fairly remote tasking with a serious need to be available on short notice, so leisure opportunities are somewhat limited," said McMahon.

Parks Canada has provided the troops with a gymnasium, a small home theatre facility and a games room in their accommodation, but some troops take advantage of the snow with outdoor activities such as skiing and snowshoeing.





## The Old Car Detective Bill Sherk



## 1928 Chrysler ran on kerosene

Martin Porter reads my column in the Brantford Expositor. He still remembers a car he drove during World War Two:

"I owned a 1928 Chrysler sedan in cahoots with my Air Force buddy Lenny Steward. We were stationed in Brantford, Ontario, at the Service Flying School in the 1940s, and had been stationed before that at the Oshawa Elementary Flying School. We had to drive back and forth between Brantford and Oshawa on weekends when we were not on duty.

"The reason for all the driving? Girl friends. So we bought an old 1928 Chrysler for \$50 from a dealer whose name I can't remember. The problem was that gas was rationed and we could only get so much, which was not quite enough.

"I, being mechanically inclined from farm experience, wondered if the old Chrysler would burn kerosene, which was more available and less expensive. We tried it out on a small scale and found that the kerosene worked just fine.

"But the engine would not start on kerosene.

"No problem.This car had a vacuum tank under the hood to suck the gas from the gas tank at the rear. It then ran by gravity down into the carburetor. I modified the system a bit so that before we shut the engine off, we would fill the vacuum tank with gasoline for the next start. As soon as the engine warmed up a bit, we would switch to the main tank, which had the kerosene.

"We had to hand crank the car to get it started because the starter motor was kaput and we couldn't get another one.

"We bought some 5-gallon cans for the kerosene and got them filled whenever we could talk a service station operator into selling us some for 'heating purposes.'

"We didn't keep those cans of kerosene in the car because they were smelly and probably illegal as a car fuel. We didn't want to get caught so we hid the cans of kerosene in various spots along the road between Oshawa

and Brantford.


"One of our spots was under the steps of the old Langford church. So if we needed to fuel up, we would stop at these spots, look up and down the road for cars coming, and then re-fuel. There weren't many cars on the road in those days on Number 2 Highway. The 401 and 403 were not in existence until after the war.

"When we got posted away from Brantford, we


sold the car back to the same dealer for \$50, still running good."

## Charge laid relating to death of presumed insurgent

A week after Christmas, Canadian Forces National Investigation Service (CFNIS) charged Captain Robert Semrau with an offence relating to the death of a presumed insurgent in Helmand Province in Afghanistan on or about Oct. 19, 2008.

Capt Semrau was charged with one count of second-degree murder, contrary to Section 130 of the National Defence Act, pursuant to Section 235(1) of the Criminal Code. Captain Semrau was a member of the Operational Mentor and Liaison Team at the time of the incident. He is accused of shooting, with intent to kill, an unarmed male person.

## One man killed and three injured in Afghanistan

One Canadian soldier was killed Jan. 7 and three others were injured when their armoured vehicle struck an improvised explosive device approximately 35 kilometres north of Kandahar City in the Shah Wali Kowt District. The fallen soldier is Trooper Brian Richard Good, from The Royal Canadian Dragoons based at Canadian Forces Base Petawawa. # Stretch your money with a tax-free savings account

Tax-Free Savings Account (TFSA), a new type of savings account, is available for Canadian residents beginning Jan. 1 2009

TFSAs allow Canadians to save money on a tax-exempt basis for any financial goal: a long-term goal such as retirement or a house or a short-term goal such as a car or a vacation

Eligibility: Canadian residents must be age 18 or older (note that a Social Insurance Number must be provided to open and administer the account). The contribution limit is

\$5,000 per year beginning 2009; the TFSA dollar limit will be indexed to inflation and rounded to the nearest \$500 in later years. Unused contribution room can be carried forward to future years. Any amounts withdrawn will also be added to contribution room in the following year.

**Over-contribution penalty**: The Canada Revenue Agency will charge a penalty of 1 per cent per month based on the actual monthly over-contribution amount.

**Deductibility**: Contributions to a TFSA cannot be deducted for income tax purposes.

**Tax on investment income**: None. Investment income (including capital gains) earned in a TFSA is not subject to tax

**Tax on withdrawals**: None. Investors can withdraw funds from a TFSA at any time for any purpose and will not be taxed or otherwise penalized.

Eligibility for federal income-tested benefits and credits: Income earned in a TFSA and withdrawals from a TFSA will not affect eligibility for benefits and credits such as the Canada Child Tax Benefit, Employment Insurance benefits, Guaranteed Income Supplement, Old Age Security

benefits, Age Credit and Goods and Services Tax Credit.

**Spousal TFSAs**: Individuals can contribute to a spouse's TFSA. Contributions made by an individual into a spouse's TFSA are not subject to the income attribution rules (since income earned within the TFSA is not taxable). On death TFSA assets can be transferred to the surviving spouse or common-law partner without affecting the contribution room of the survivor.

**Transfer rules**: Individuals can transfer investments from an existing non-registered account into a TFSA, just as they can transfer investments from an existing non-registered account into a Registered Retirement Savings Plan (RRSP). The investments transferred are deemed to have been disposed at fair market value. This may trigger a capital gain which would be taxable and reported on an individual's income tax return. If a capital loss is triggered, the loss may be denied under the superficial loss rules.

**Tracking contribution limits**: Each year, the government determines and advises individuals of their TFSA contribution limits for that tax year.

# Walking tall in Afghanistan

If Zharey District in Kandahar Province is the Wild West of Afghanistan — and it often looks like it — then the beleaguered men of the Afghan Uniformed Police are the often outnumbered and outgunned, and always under-appreciated, frontier lawmen.

In the thick of it with them are Canadian soldiers and military police of the Police Operational Mentor and Liaison Team (POMLT). The POMLT are there to help Afghan Uniformed Police build capacity and capabilities so they can overcome the increasingly sophisticated tactics of the Taliban insurgency. POMLT combines the aggressive combat training and experience of infantry soldiers, most of them from the 1st Battalion, The Royal Canadian Regiment in Petawawa, ON, with the policing skills of members of 2 Military Police Unit, also in Petawawa.

Over seven months of intense pre-deployment training, the infantry soldiers and the military police — often at odds with each other back home in garrison — formed a tight-knit team. Now, more than half-way through their tour, it is often difficult to tell the MPs and the Royals apart when they

are patrolling together.

The POMLT in Zharey
District also benefits from
the presence of civilian
constables from several
Canadian police agencies.
Three of the infantry soldiers
are army reservists who, in
their civilian capacity, are
Peel Regional Police constables based in Mississauga
and Brampton, ON.

A constable from the Durham Regional Police and a Royal Canadian Mounted Police corporal, members of the civilian police contingent of the Kandahar Provincial Reconstruction Team, also patrol regula arly with the POMLT. The civilian police members contribute a civilian perspective that is important when dealing with the Afghan Uniformed Police, and provide a crucial link to the KPRT resources at Camp Nathan Smith in Kandahar City, 30 kilometres east of the Zharey POMLT's beat.

POMLT members live with Afghan Uniformed

Regular foot patrols of the surrounding villages and countryside are interspersed with regular classroom instruction.

Police detachments throughout Zharey District, sharing the risks and austere conditions with their Afghan police counterparts.

If the conflict in Afghanistan has a front line, this is it.

Regular foot patrols of the surrounding villages and countryside are interspersed with classroom instruction on police topics such as Afghan law, community policing, and the correct techniques for searching persons, vehicles and compounds.

Foot patrols are as close as Afghan police get to walking the beat. Patrolling is done to encourage them to talk to people, and to engage village elders and other leaders to address issues ranging from local crime to development and reconstruction projects.

To meet the challenges of policing in the midst of insurgency, joint POMLT-Afghan Uniformed Police patrols are well armed and prepared to fight if necessary, although their purpose is to demonstrate a police presence. As police patrols increase in frequency, and Afghan Uniformed Police equipment and training improve, the POMLT mentors and their Afghan colleagues are gradually stabilizing the areas surrounding police detachments in Zharey District.

As confidence in the legitimate Afghan government grows, people come to police detachments to report crimes and insurgent activity. This increased confidence and participation by the population in their own security are helping the Afghan National Army and the International Security Assistance Force disrupt Taliban operations in Zharey District.

Zharey District may be the Wild West, but Canadians can rest assured that their soldiers and police are making a significant difference with the local lawmen, the Afghan Uniformed Police.

It was not a major halfmarathon, but the spirit of competition was still evident.

were here for the feeling of accomplishment. Despite some sore muscles, I think everyone had a good time," added Capt Williams at the end of the race.

## Warships part of massive LEGO display

Naval ships and a submarine are but one part of a massive Halifax cityscape constructed entirely with LEGO.

The City by the Sea exhibit at the Maritime Museum of the Atlantic is created by Nova Scotia LEGO Users' Group (NovaLUG), in partnership with the museum.

The battleship grey hulls and black submarine were built by NovaLUG members, and are a new addition to the annual display located on the museum's ground floor.
