In the ship category, Ottawa narrowly edged past HMCS Protecteur by a mere 52 votes, while the Fire Station blew away competitors in the building category, including the perennial favourite Admiral's Residence.

Capt(N) Craig Baines, Base Commander at CFB Esquimalt, was elated with everyone's effort.

"I'm extremely proud of the entire team's creativity and hard work, especially those who volunteered their personal time to help make this event a success," he said. "I want to thank all the people who visited and made a donation to the Mustard Seed, as well as our business and media sponsors for their support. Like all the important missions we do in the Canadian Forces, this contest is a true team effort."

Among the decorations were the trad-

itional Santas and reindeers, candy canes and Christmas trees. Non-traditional florescent hockey signs illuminated the decks of some ships, while a larger-than-life Darth Vader, Yoda, and other Star Wars memorabilia decorated another. There were also lights. Thousands of them winked, blinked, and flickered around the base signalling the 23rd Annual Navy Lighting Contest, which ran from Dec. 14-24. Approximately 5,200 visitors took in the festivities, which also saw a donation of over \$18,000 in money and food contributions.

Brent Palmer, Director of the Mustard Seed Food Bank, thanked everyone associated with the contest for their charitable spirit.

"The Mustard Seed is extremely grateful to the Navy for hosting this event once again and for the response of Victorians attending the contest," he said.



Naval museum offering a piece of history

footage of a long ago Royal visit has been discovered by CFB Esquimalt Naval and Military Museum staff while rooting through their archives.

Fourteen minutes of 16mm colour film capture King George VI and his wife Queen Elizabeth during a tour of the city in May 1939. The silent film shows the King presenting his Colour to the Royal Canadian Navy at a ceremony in Beacon Hill Park.

It was the first visit of a reigning sovereign to Canada.

The film has since been transferred to DVD. Museum staff is also transferring similar 16mm films to DVD to ensure their longevity as the original film could deteriorate. To

Season of the Witch another flop for Cage

Happy New Year, movie lovers, and welcome to what amounts to two meagre offerings for the start of this cold January. Opening this weekend is the Nicolas Cage supernatural thriller, Season Of The Witch, which co-stars Ron Perlman, and the musical drama Country Strong, with Garrett Hedlund and Gwyneth Paltrow.

Season Of The Witch

Nicolas Cage has made some bad movies throughout his long and memorable career, but Season of the Witch may be the bad movie to finally make us all ask what Cage does to choose his projects. Based on the dismal reviews the film is getting, which paint a picture far darker than Cage's previous disaster, The Wicker Man, it seems like Cage simply picks the first script that lands on his desk that uses the words "supernatural" and is willing to pay him a healthy wad of cash.

Set in the days following the Crusades, Cage plays Behmen, a knight who returns home to discover his homeland has been devastated by the Black Plague. Joined by his soldier buddy Felson, played by the wonderful Ron Perlman, the friends are forced to assist church elders who swear that a local woman is actually a witch who has cursed the land, and the only way to lift the terrible blight is to have her dealt with by a far-away monastery.

Journeying across the land, the duo have to face many challenges on their road, and on the way they also discover the truth about the girl and the force that is trying to defeat them on their quest, which will also change the fate of the world.

While I'm a big fan of Perlman, and of Cage to some degree, the film looks absolutely ridiculous, and with its three per cent fresh rating on Rotten Tomatoes, the critics are all agreeing on that

"Season of the Witch isn't quite Jonah Hex or Little Fockers bad," wrote Jim Vejvoda for IGN Movies, "but it's one helluva shoddy way to start off the year in movies and yet another crummy entry in Nicolas Cage's woeful post-Oscar filmography."

Since the film was dumped in January, the key month for disappointing movies, it's no big surprise that Season of the Witch is a dud, but it's also worth noting that the film was directed by Dominic Sena, the man responsible for the horrible little thriller Whiteout. The director's only two decent hits to date were Gone in 60 Seconds and Swordfish, which weren't exactly mindblowing films either, but apparently he still has enough clout in Hollywood to keep him from waiting tables.

The incomprehensible thing about Cage is how the heavily lauded actor can go from a film like Bad Lieutenant: Port of Call New Orleans, where he delivered one of his all-time great performances of his career, to tripe like Season Of The Witch. The only explanation I can come up with is that he's more concerned with paychecks and weird roles than being careful with the parts he picks to play. That said, there's no doubt that Cage picks interesting themes and concepts. This concept just comes up short.

Country Strong

On a somewhat brighter note this week there is director Shana Feste's twangy drama, Country Strong, starring Garrett Hedlund, Leighton Meester, and Gwyneth Paltrow.

Hedlund stars as a rising singersongwriter who gets wrapped up with a down-but-not-quiteout country singer, played by Gwyneth Paltrow. Teaming up to try to make another name for herself, the duo go on tour with her husband, played by Tim McGraw, and a young singer, played by Leighton Meester. On the road the four duelling personalities will face old and new troubles, and face off against conflicted emotions that could ruin them all if they don't get them under control.

Featuring original music and an intriguing concept, Country Strong is not getting rave reviews, but it is holding its own.

Shedding light on forgotten heroes

Last month, Army Staff Salvatore Giunta became the first living recipient of the Medal of Honor since the Vietnam War. The highest distinction earned in the U.S. military, Staff Sgt Giunta was awarded the medal for his role during a fearsome firefight in Afghanistan that saw him retrieve and protect the body of a fallen friend and fellow soldier.

His valour now unites him with more than 3,400 Medal of Honor recipients since its creation in 1863 - 101 of those being Canadian or with connections to Canada.

It's this little known fact, and one of many that have motivated Master Warrant Officer Bart Armstrong for over a decade to exhume military history for inclusion in his book Forgotten Heroes: 101 men, mostly Canadian, awarded the U.S. Medal of Honor.

Serving 17 years in the Army Reserves on both coasts, his parents being military veterans, and having a Victoria Cross recipient in his ancestry have given him this strong desire to study military medals and honours.

"The research I'm doing hasn't been adequately covered before," says MWO Armstrong. "The book I'm writing is preserving and bringing to the public's attention these incredible

Of the 101 Canadian recipients, over half earned their Medal of Honor in the Civil War. Beginning in the early 1860s, 50,000 Canadians went south to fight. Some for the pay, some for the adventure, but all were put into the U.S. Army, Navy and Marines. During the conflict, 25 per cent of the Medal of Honor recipients were non-Americans by birth; post Civil War, 20 per cent.

Armstrong passionately recounts the story of Benjamin Franklin Youngs. Born and raised in Zorra, Ontario, Youngs was one of the thousands who went south to help in the war effort of 1863.

Taking the marksmanship skills he learned on the farm, 19-year-old Youngs enlisted with the First Michigan Volunteer Sharpshooters.

For months he battled Confederates with his unit through the Virginia countryside. It was during their advance on Richmond they came up against the 35th North Carolina Infantry. Driving the 35th back to their entrenchments, Youngs leapt into the trench and retrieved their Confederate States of America flag. Turning back and running with the flag towards friendly lines, Youngs dodged barrages of whizzing musket fire before finally handing the flag off to his General.

Awarded the Medal of Honor for his bravery in the heat of battle, Youngs survived the war and died in 1927.

Through Armstrong's investigation, he found out Youngs, as well as other Canadian Medal of Honor recipients, never received a military burial for soldiers with such distinction.

MWO Armstrong has joined the American-based Medal of Honor Historical Society, an organization interested in preserving the tradition of the award. As a member he has been vital in tracking down most of the burial sites of these 101 Canadians and many of the graves not having markers indicating the hero's status have been updated to reflect this status.

His book will have an estimated 100 chapters, so he may release it in two volumes: the first covering the Civil War era, the second on wars that followed. Each chapter will include in-depth backgrounds, biographies, and, where available, pictures of many actual medals awarded to some of the 101 Canadian recipients.

Having spent the past decade sifting through libraries, historical societies, genealogy societies, museum archives, and the Internet, Armstrong has learned not to put an exact release date for his book. He also goes to great lengths to acknowledge the help of many people during this research, especially the folks and resources of the Victoria Genealogical Society such as Diane Clarke.

"It gets done when it gets done. I hope in the next year, maybe in the next two," he said.

Nowhere but up

As 2Lt Callum Campbell's head breaks the surface of the water, his hands search for the sides of the old tub. He draws in a large breath. The scent of aviation fuel singes his throat. A firm hand under his shoulder pulls him up, then a handshake, then another, and another. Dripping wet, a grin spreads across his face. He's done it, flown his first solo flight and completed a ritual dedicated to Air Force pilots after passing the first phase of training.

Only 30 minutes ago he was taxiing the runway at the Southport Aerospace Centre in Portage La Prairie, MB, in a CT-120A Grob. His task was to take off in the trainer, circle the airfield and land three times without error.

The flight was part of the primary pilot selection and training at 3 Canadian Forces Flying Training School, a demanding selection course meant to weed out pilots from the pack.

The aircraft, a two-seated and aerobatic low-wing plane,

provided the ideal platform for the manoeuvres at both high and low airspeeds. Contracted civilian instructors graded his performance, and found it to be sufficient for him to pass and move on to the next phase of becoming a fully trained Air Force pilot.

His elation was hard to hide as he stepped out of the aircraft onto the runway. It continues to resonate months after his test flight.

"My goal in the Canadian Forces is first and foremost to be awarded my Canadian Forces Pilot Wings. Beyond that, simply being the best pilot I can be," he says.

The 22-year-old Victoria native has learned duty, service, and responsibility from his father, an ex-police officer.

A month after turning 12 2Lt Campbell joined cadets. Like most boys his age, the opportunity to wear the stylish uniform and learn weapons handling was alluring. He had a difficult choice to make: Air, Sea, or Army Cadets?

"I knew how to sail [already] and Air Cadets also taught me how to shoot, so I felt Air Cadets would be the most beneficial," recalls Campbell. "Shortly after joining. I

contemplated quitting; it wasn't until discovering the thrill of aviation that I found a passion for something that could entertain me for a lifetime."

As a member of the 89th Pacific Air Cadets Squadron, he learned everything he could from his instructors and superiors

"Being a member of the 89th Pacific Squadron allowed me to grow as a person and taught me many life lessons I still find incredibly applicable today," he says.

Over six years, cadets turned a boy into a confident man, instilling selfdiscipline, and the ability to teach and speak effectively.

"Perhaps most important to my particular vocation are the skills I gained through the practical and theoretical application of aviation knowledge."

During his years with the 89th Campbell was given a scholarship to obtain his gliders and private pilot's licenses.

After graduating from Claremont Secondary in the summer of 2006, he officially retired from the Air Cadet program a few months later. However, he was drawn back by his desire to give back. So he signed on to instruct the Introduction to Leadership

contemplated quitting; it course at Albert Head Air wasn't until discovering Cadet Summer Training the thrill of aviation that I Centre for a year.

Following that, he completed a year at the University of Victoria, then made the decision to follow his passion for flying and joined the Regular Forces as a pilot under the Continuing Education Officer Training Program.

He completed the Basic Officer Training Program and five months after wondering if he had made the right decision, he was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant, an officer in the Canadian Forces.

Upon the completion of phase one of his pilots' training, he moved back to Victoria and is currently working at 443 Maritime Helicopter Squadron. This experience has solidified his desire to fly the helicopters, or their soon-to-be replacement Cyclones, upon graduation.

In the New Year, he'll return to Manitoba for phase two of his four phase training. It will be eight to 10 months of intensive advanced flight training.

As for now, it's a matter of patience before he can get airborne again. Even though waiting is tedious, 2Lt Campbell has the wherewithal to know he's one of the lucky few making a life out of something he loves.


